
# LOCUST CENTRAL BUSINESS DISTRICT (LBD) 2024 ACCOMPLISHMENTS

 Approved a new Strategic Plan for 2025-2027 with 2024 accomplishments, listed below, categorized under plan's Strategic Priorities



#### Safety

- o Provided secondary security services within the boundaries of the LBD
- Participated in security meetings twice-weekly hosted by the Downtown CID and monthly hosted by Grand Center, Inc. and the Downtown Neighborhood Association
- Formed positive day-to-day relationships with SLMPD 4<sup>th</sup> District Captain Chris Stamper, Community Engagement Officers, and others on police force
- Launched 50:50 exterior lighting program to improve sense of security and beautification
- Secured new stop signs on Locust at 22<sup>nd</sup> St. Previously, there were no stop signs on Locust between N. Jefferson and 20<sup>th</sup> St.

### Cleanliness

- o Provided daily trash pick-up and periodic leaf removal and weed mitigation services
- Installed 15 new 55-gallon trash receptacles and 10 new pet waste clean-up stations
- o Hosted 4<sup>th</sup> annual LBD Clean-Up Day with Operation Brightside and community volunteers
- Received approval for sidewalk replacement at southeast corner of Locust and 22<sup>nd</sup> St. utilizing Ward Capital Funds provided by 14<sup>th</sup> Ward Alderman Rasheen Aldridge

### Connectivity

- Launched new website at locustbusinessdistrict.com including a comprehensive list of LBD businesses, schools, and nonprofits, an LBD New Business Guide, and other resources
- Maintained and operated the LBD-owned parking lot for the use and benefit of residents and businesses in the neighborhood
  - Installed new LED light fixtures in the parking lot to improve lighting and environmental impacts, and bring down costs
- Hosted MetroLink Green Line presentation for LBD stakeholders and continued participation on Green Line forums
- Provided testimony on LBD operations before the Board of Aldermen's Special Committee on Special Taxing Districts at request of Chairman Ald. Aldridge

- Hosted open, hybrid monthly Board meetings and welcomed guest speakers including 11<sup>th</sup>

  Gabe Gore, and other community members
